Prayer points-

- 2 Ask the Lord for wisdom in our responses to criticism directed at any brother that has fallen. Opinions do not matter but what the Holy Spirit is saying though the Word.
- 3. Pray we cover one another in a deeper way so that we may have a listening ear even if we differ in opinion. We should direct one another according to scripture. The truth is when any of us goes awry it is a reflection of a wound within that soul that was never addressed or exposed before.

Scriptures-

Galatians 6:1

Brothers, if anyone is caught in any transgression, you who are spiritual should restore him in a spirit of gentleness. Keep watch on yourself, lest you too be tempted.

<u>Matthew 18 15</u> "If your brother or sister[b] sins,[c] go and point out their fault, just between the two of you. If they listen to you, you have won them over. **16** But if they will not listen, take one or two others along, so that 'every matter may be established by the testimony of two or three witnesses.**17** If they still refuse to listen, tell it to the church; and if they refuse to listen even to the church, treat them as you would a pagan or a tax collector.

<u>Matthew 18 6</u> "If anyone causes one of these little ones—those who believe in me—to stumble, it would be better for them to have a large millstone hung around their neck and to be drowned in the depths of the sea. **7** Woe to the world because of the things that cause people to stumble! Such things must come, but woe to the person through whom they come!

<u>Philippians 4:12–13</u> I know both how to be abased, and I know how to abound: everywhere and in all things am instructed both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need. 13 I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me.

Ephesians 5:19-21 Speak to each other with psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs, singing and making music in your hearts to the Lord. Always give thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Yield to obey each other as you would to Christ.
